Activity - County List 4-H Year: 2016-2017

Activities – Please sign up for these activities and contests under the “Activities” tab. If you want to be notified of an activity you should sign up for it even if you aren’t sure you are going to participate. These activities are totally separate from projects. All these activities involve a contest. If there is a county contest it will be announced by the volunteers working with the youth. All of the following state contests are held at showcase showdown in June, except meats and wool judging are both in Laramie in April and Livestock Judging is at the Wyoming State Fair in August.

Cake Decorating Contest	In the cake decorating contest youth are provided sheet cakes, white butter cream frosting and a cake to decorate in one hour based around a theme given to them on the day of the event. Youth can enter in the individual category or as a team with teams being comprised of 2-3 youth in the same age division. There is no limit to the number of youth or teams that enter.
Dog Skill-A-Thon	The dog skill-a-thon contest is an opportunity for youth interested in dogs to compete using knowledge gained in the 4-H dog project. The contest consists of both an individual contest and a team contest. Teams can be comprised of 3-4 youth in the same age division. There is no limit to the number of youth or teams that can enter.
Food Cook-Off	Food cook-off showcases youth’s knowledge of the food and nutrition project. Youth work as a team to prepare a dish in one hour utilizing ingredients off of a pre-published list of ingredients. Teams are comprised of 2-3 youth in the same age division. There is no limit to the number of teams that can enter.
Horse Hippology	Horse hippology provides an opportunity for youth to work as a team to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of equine science and management. Teams consist of a maximum of four youth in the same age division. There is no limit to the number of teams that can enter.
Judging - Horse	The horse judging contest consists of members placing classes of performance or halter horses and completing either reasons or questions based on their age division. This contest is done individually. Counties can enter an unlimited number of individual members and only one senior team and one junior team.
Judging - Livestock	The livestock judging contest consists of members placing classes of market or breeding sheep, swine, beef and goats and completing either reasons or questions based on their age division. This contest is done individually. Counties can enter an unlimited number of individual members and only one senior team and one junior team.
Judging - Meats	The meats judging contest consists of members placing classes of meat cuts; identifying 20-30 meat cuts and completing either reasons or questions based on their age division. This contest is done individually. Counties can enter an unlimited number of individual members and only one senior team and one junior team.
Judging - Produce	The produce judging contest consists of members placing up to 8 classes of fruits or vegetables; identifying 20-30 produce items and completing either reasons or questions based on their age division. This contest is done individually. Counties can enter an unlimited number of individual members and only one senior team and one junior team.
Judging - Wool	The wool judging contest consists of members placing classes of wool fleeces; grading 20-30 wool fleeces and completing either reasons or questions based on their age division. This contest is done individually. Counties can enter an unlimited number of individual members and only one senior team and one junior team.
Livestock Skill-A-Thon	Livestock skill-a-thon allows youth to work as a team to demonstrate their knowledge and skills acquired in livestock & meats judging, feeds, equipment, breeds, parts and quality assurance into one activity. Teams consist of 3-5 members of the same age group. There is no limit to the number of teams that can enter.
Presentations - Impromptu	Impromptu presentations is a speaking contest that emphasizes the need for participants to think clearly and effectively on a topic with a short amount of preparation time. Contestants draw a topic and have 3 minutes to prepare a speech. There is no limit to the number of youth that can enter.
Presentations - Prepared	Prepared presentation contest emphasizes the development of verbal communication skills. Presentation delivery may include, but is not limited to, demonstrations, interactive exhibits, skits, drama, public speaking, visual aids and/or multimedia displays. Youth can enter this contest as an individual or a team. There is no limit to the number of youth or teams that enter.
Creed Contest	The 4-H Creed Contest is designed to allow 4-H members to compete in a friendly, less-formal speaking competition designed to build public speaking confidence and skills. Creed speaking is open to participants of all age categories. The junior division contestants can choose to give the creed by memory or read it. The 4-H Creed is pre-written and available from the Extension Office.
Robotics Contest	The Robotics contest provides educational competitions where students can develop their creativity, engineering, problem solving and leadership skills. The contest consists of three areas: construction, mini-sumo and robo-maze. Youth can enter individually or as a team. There is no limit to the number of youth or teams that can enter.
Rocketry Contest	The rocketry contest showcases what youth have learned in the aerospace project. It consists of two categories; 1. A team rocketry challenge where 3-5 youth work together to give a 1-3 min presentation on the rocket they build and then launch it; 2. An open rocketry contest for individuals who give a 2-5 min. presentation on the rocket they built before launching it. There is no limit to the number of youth or teams that can enter.
Table Setting	In table setting, participants will demonstrate their ability to properly set a table for one guest at a meal/event. Youth bring their own pre-designed table setting and menu to the contest, set it up and do an interview. Open to individual contestants only.
