The Uinta County Youth Ag. Program is designed to allow youth who do not reside at a residence that allows them to raise an animal an opportunity to raise and interact with an animal. Participants must be members of the Uinta County 4-H Program in good standing.

This agreement is entered on this _____ of _____, 2019 between the Youth Ag. Entrepreneurship Program (YAP) and participant(s) as stated above for the **2019** Summer Program.

By being a member of the Uinta County Youth Ag. Program, **participant(s)** is responsible for providing the following:

- ★ Their own animals.
- ★ Feed of all necessary types for his/her animal.

The **Uinta County Youth Ag. Program** agrees to provide:

- ★ A place to keep the animals. Animals are welcome from April 1 thru August 29.
- ★ Water may not be available at the barns at all times, requiring youth to haul it from a different location as specified.
- ★ Feeding equipment including water buckets and feed pans on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- ★ Cleaning tools including apple pickers, brooms, rakes, shovels, and wheel barrels.

As a team member, participant(s) agrees to:

- ★ Pay a \$20.00 rental fee per member
- ★ Feed and water their animal(s) every day. If participant is unable to feed their animal(s) for any reason, they agree to make arrangements with another individual to do it for them.
- ★ Clean their pen at least once a week to keep flies and the smell under control. All manure must be hauled and dumped in the designated manure management area.
- ★ Sweep or rake in front of their pen on a daily basis in order to keep the barn in a neat appearance.
- ★ Exercise their animal weekly or daily depending on the species of animal.

- ★ Move their animal when it is requested by the Extension Office, or designated barn leaders.
- ★ Help keep the sheds clean and in an orderly fashion.
- ★ Put all equipment away after they have used it.
- ★ Not to feed any other animals in the program. If any animal is out of water, we encourage you to water it.
- ★ Assist with manure management if needed.
- ★ Lock the shed and gate each time they leave the fairgrounds. (Excluding the gate during business hours).
- ★ **A \$25 deposit and a signed contract will be required before a key can be checked out. Lost keys will be considered the same as a "not returned" key. If a key is not returned by 1-week after animals are removed from fairgrounds, the deposit will be forfeited.**
- ★ If a padlock is lost, damaged or broken, the cost of replacing the lock (\$50 per lock) will be split among all YAP participants.
- ★ Replace any YAP equipment that is damaged due to participant(s). Equipment will be checked out. Once a piece of equipment is checked out it becomes the responsibility of the youth. If it is lost, they are responsible for replacing it.
- ★ All keys and equipment must be checked in by Extension Personnel at the Extension Office no later than 1-week after removing animals from the grounds. Failure to comply with this rule may result in your inability to be part of this program in the future.
- ★ Carry their own livestock insurance if wanted. Animals are not covered by an insurance policy for replacement.
- ★ Participate in the YAP Community Service project.
- ★ Participants and parents are required to attend a Barn Meeting prior to receiving keys or storing any equipment at the fairgrounds.
- ★ Attend a mandatory barn meeting with the Extension Office Staff.

As a team, we can all have a more successful program. So... let's all chip in and help each other keep our barn clean and the shed in an orderly fashion. We are the eyes and ears for each other.

Being involved in the Youth Ag. Program is an honor, not a privilege. If, for any reason, the responsibilities in this contract are not fulfilled and carried out by the participant(s) they will relinquish their right to be part of the program and will remove their animal from the premises, check in all keys and equipment and will not be allowed to participate in the program in the future.
